Tang sees theatre as a way to experience life through self-discovery where the Actor's body is the primary means of expression of theatrical arts. He is renowned for interpreting dramatic texts with a minimalist aesthetics. He

and "one of the most talented theatre directors in Hong

Kong". Tang has directed over 50 productions of stage works including drama, dance-theatre and opera, of which Titus Andronicus, Titus Andronicus 2.0, Thunderstorm, Macbeth, Datong, Antigone, Peach Blossom Fan, Les Contes d'Hoffmann and Our Death Won't Hurt Anybody are his essential works of late, and which have all been toured to many cities.
